



Georgia Campaign for Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention Richmond County Community-wide Teen Pregnancy Prevention Initiative

Executive Summary

With funding from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the **Georgia Campaign for Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention (G-CAPP)** will work with 10 youth serving organizations and five reproductive health clinics in Richmond County, Georgia to implement a community-wide initiative to reduce teen births by 10% by 2015. This five-year initiative will reach over 16,000 youth 15-19.

Richmond County has a teen birth rate of 71.2 per 1,000 girls aged 15-19 and equally troubling STI rates. G-CAPP will use Muscogee County as the comparison county to evaluate the effectiveness of the intervention.

G-CAPP and its partners will use four strategies to reduce teen pregnancy:

1. Implement evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention programs in the community
2. Link teens to quality health services
3. Conduct stakeholder education to increase support of evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention strategies
4. Improve the sustainability of the partner organizations and the initiative

Through this unified, community-based initiative, young people will have access to evidence-based teen pregnancy prevention programs and clinical services; policymakers and decision makers will adopt strategies and policies in the community to support adolescent and sexual reproductive health, and state and local funders will support this community-initiative and others similar to it.
