Introduction

The Breast and Cervical Program was established to provide screening and follow-up services to low income, uninsured/underinsured women throughout the state of Georgia because “**Early Detection Saves Lives**”. This program is funded through federal and state grants.

Eligibility

- GA Resident
- Low Income
- No Insurance
- Underinsured

The program provides FREE:

Age 21 +

- Pap test
- Abnormal breast or cervical follow-up for women ages 21+

Age 40 +

- Clinical Breast Exam(CBE)
- Pelvic exam
- Pap test
- Mammogram to women ages 40-64



The Facts about Breast Cancer

Most breast lumps are not cancer!!!

- All women are at risk
- The risk increases as you get older
- It is the second-leading cause of cancer death in women.

What You Can Do

- Become familiar with how your breasts normally look and feel
- Report any new breast changes to a health care professional as soon as they are found.

Ages 20-39

- Have a health care provider perform a breast exam every 3 years

Age 40 +

- Have a health care provider perform a clinical breast exam
- Get your mammogram every year or as directed by your provider

The Facts about Cervical Cancer

No women should die of cervical cancer.

- It is one of the most preventable cancers.

What You Can Do

All women should begin cervical cancer screening at age 21.

Women 21-29

- Pap test every 3 years

Women 30-64

- Pap test every 3
- HPV test AND Pap test every 5 years

Women over 65:

- No further testing if you have had 3 normal pap test results in the past 10 years
